The Declaration of Fidelity to the Irish Nation and Loyalty to the State

The declaration states that you will respect the rights, freedoms and laws of Ireland. You will be given the words of the declaration on the day and you won't have to memorise them.

"I (name) having applied to the Minister for Justice for a certificate of naturalisation, hereby solemnly declare my fidelity to the Irish nation and my loyalty to the State. I undertake to faithfully observe the laws of the State and to respect its democratic values."

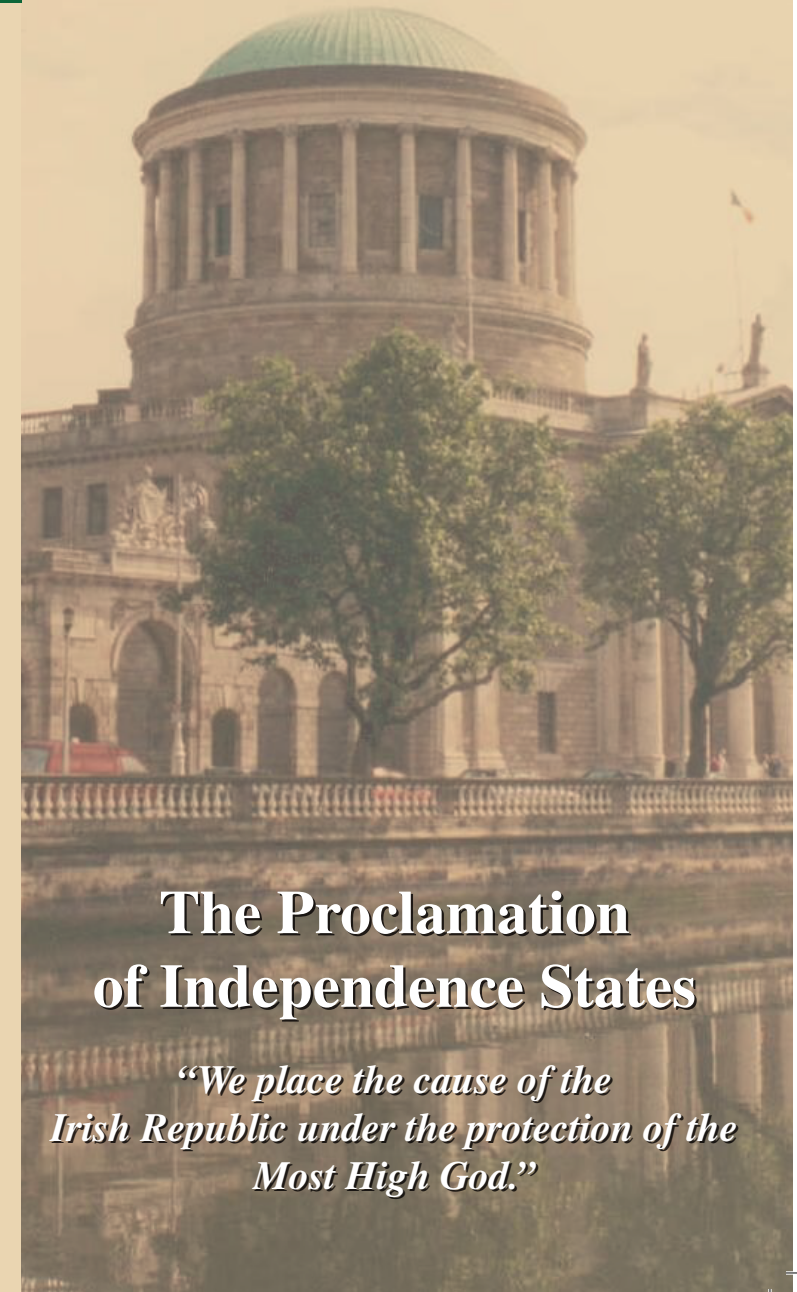
Notice in the Declaration of fidelity to the Irish Nation, that the individual is not required to acknowledge, or take any Oath which esteems the Christian Constitution of the Irish People. This oversight by the Irish Government can potentially cause much societal and judicial upset within our institutions, as it leaves room for any aspiring interloper to deceitfully swear Oaths they do not intend to uphold. It also leaves the door open for those who have no intention of integrating with regard to the long-cherished values of the Irish People.

Which begs the question, what could such motives say about any proposed "fidelity to the Irish nation and my loyalty to the State"

The Proclamation of Independence States

Dear Deputy _____
I write to you to express my concern on the implementation of Oaths within our long-established institutions, in the pursuit of attaining true social order within Irish Society.

I am strongly of the conviction, that the upholding of Oaths in concord with our Constitution, should be a matter of upmost importance, that needs to be addressed before the Oireachtas.

I strongly oppose any latent neglect of Irish Law, where Oaths to uphold our Constitution, are diluted, casually taken, or not upheld at all.

The swearing of Oaths is a prime obligation of national significance, for anyone who undertakes to serve the Irish People, in which I expect my Civil Servants to be forthright and honest to the Oaths they swear and to the Constitution of Ireland.

The Judges Oath

According to Article 35.2 of the Constitution "All judges shall be independent in the exercise of their judicial functions and subject only to this Constitution and the law." Every person appointed a judge must take the oath set out in Article 34.6.1 of the Constitution as follows:

"In the presence of Almighty God, I do solemnly and sincerely promise and declare that I will duly and faithfully and to the best of my knowledge and power execute the office of Chief Justice (or as the case may be) without fear or favour, affection or ill-will towards any man, and that I will uphold the Constitution and the laws. May God direct and sustain me."

The Defence Forces Oath

PERMANENT DEFENCE FORCE

"I,, do solemnly swear (or declare) that I will be faithful to Ireland and loyal to the Constitution and that while I am an officer of the Permanent Defence Force I will obey all lawful orders issued to me by my superior officers and will not join or be a member of or subscribe to any political organisation or society or any secret society whatsoever."

An Garda Síochána Oath

On being appointed, each member of the Garda Síochána shall make before a Peace Commissioner a declaration in the following form:

*"I hereby solemnly and sincerely declare before God that—
I will faithfully discharge the duties of a member of the Garda Síochána with fairness, integrity, regard for human rights, diligence and impartiality, upholding the Constitution and the laws and according equal respect to all people, •
while I continue to be a member, I will to the best of my skill and knowledge discharge all my duties according to law, and
• I do not belong to, and will not while I remain a member form, belong to or subscribe to, any political party or secret society whatsoever."*

In the Name of the Most Holy Trinity, from Whom is all authority and to Whom, as our final end, all actions both of men and States must be referred, We, the people of Éire, Humbly acknowledging all our obligations to our Divine Lord, Jesus Christ, Who sustained our fathers through centuries of trial, Gratefully remembering their heroic and unremitting struggle to regain the rightful independence of our Nation, And seeking to promote the common good, with due observance of Prudence, Justice and Charity, so that the dignity and freedom of the individual may be assured, true social order attained, the unity of our country restored, and concord established with other nations, Do hereby adopt, enact, and give to ourselves this Constitution.
